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OVERVIEW

The Public Procurement Agency (PPA) serves as the hub of public procurement in Albania, coordinating, monitoring, and reporting on the procurement offices and operations of a wide range of government organizations. The Public Procurement component of the Millennium Challenge Albania Threshold Agreement project aims to improve the capacity of the PPA to conduct transparent procurements and to enable the private sector to monitor effectively the public procurement.

The two-year \$13.85 million Millennium Challenge Albania Threshold Agreement between the Government of Albania (GoA) and Millennium Challenge Corporation, implemented by USAID, assists the GoA to improve performance in tax administration, public procurement, and business registration, through IT solutions and legislative enhancements.

MAIN ACTIVITIES

The project's Public Procurement Component works to achieve the following results:

Regulations and Explanatory Guidance Developed and Implemented. This includes producing regulations that provide guidance on the new legal framework and explanatory direction for PPA officials and businesses.

PPA Capacity for Transparent Procurement Process Institutionalized. An IT system of online procurement will be installed. The system will integrate government procurement offices, monitor compliance, and establish audit trails.

Businesses Empowered to Hold the PPA Accountable for Compliance. The Public Procurement Advocate office will be established and a multi-media campaign to educate businesses on their rights and responsibilities will be implemented.

RESULTS TO DATE:

- The Council of Ministers approved the regulations for e-procurement; legal framework for e-procurement in Albania is complete.
- Upgrades of the PPA website allow for economic operators to download tender documents free of charge and in anonymity.
- The e-procurement system is developed and is ready for use by government institutions.
- The Public Procurement Advocate was appointed and his office is open to address concerns by economic operators.
- More than 720 PPA and contracting authority officials, as well as 180 businessmen and women from all over Albania were informed on the new PP law and procedures and e-procurement.
